- The values of openness and tolerance

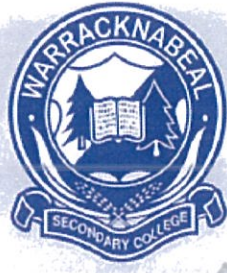
